Regulatory updates:

- The FDA has issued an EUA to allow the KN95 mask from China as acceptable.
- CDC issued revised guidance that <u>all citizens should wear cloth</u> face covering, especially those in areas of significant community-based transmission.
- CMS issued updated guidance for <u>long term care facilities</u> that includes screening employees on entry and expanded laboratory access.
- Joint Commission has issued guidance on PPE including healthcare workers <u>supplying</u> their own PPE.
- The NCDHHS Dashboard tracking COVID (including testing information) is available at this <u>link</u>. It includes breakdown by age and sex.
- <u>CDC guidance</u> for daycares that remain open.

News Updates

- The US national percentage of respiratory specimens testing positive for SARS-CoV-2 is now approximately 15% with a small variance between public health, clinical, and commercial laboratories.
- Washington, one of the earliest and most heavily infected states, is now re-deploying ventilators to other states.
- New cases continue to be reported in Italy, Spain, Germany, France, U.K and the U.S.
- Although the Abbot Diagnostic test (ID NOW COVID-19) test has received an EUA from the FDA and results can be available in less than 15 minutes, only one test can be run at a time, which greatly limits the daily number of tests that can be run.
